2014-2015 Academic Profile

Cedar Tree Classical Christian School of Ridgefield, Washington, was established in 1999 as a non-denominational Christian K-12 school, and follows the classical model of education. Cedar Tree's mission is to provide an excellent Christian, classical education that cultivates minds and nurtures hearts for effective, Christ-centered living. As such, the curriculum is demanding and rigorous at all levels. Cedar Tree is accredited by the Association of Classical & Christian Schools (November 2012).

Cedar Tree offers two diploma types for graduation: The Standard Diploma (minimum of 46 semester credits) and the Honors Diploma (minimum of 53 semester credits). All core courses are taught at the Honors level.

Testing: Total SAT scores since our first graduating class of 2012 range from 1748 to 1961, well above the national SAT score average of 1496 for that time period. Total PSAT scores since our first graduating class of 2012 range from 170 to 188, well above the national PSAT score average of 143 for that time period. Of the 26 juniors who have taken the PSAT examination, two students were awarded National Merit Scholar Finalist status, and one student received National Merit Scholar Commended status. Although we do not offer AP courses, students have successfully taken AP exams in English Literature & Composition, English Language & Composition, Spanish Language, and AP Latin, with two students have receiving AP Scholar designation thus far.
